- (1) Legend of Facility Operational Status
- (2) Sorting
 - This will organize the facilities on the page, based on your selection. To request a different order, select the radio button that you desire and click the 'Sort/Filter' button (button is found inside of box "3" on the example).
- (3) Filtering
 - The 'default' facilities shown on the page are all facilities currently in the Secretary's Summary Report. This is a timesaving feature to help users get directly to facilities inside the counties of an affected event. This will include facilities that meet **ALL** of the following pre-requisites:
 - Facilities located inside a county of an active event. (Any event that does not have an End Date is considered to be an active event.)
 - Large facilities

- Drinking Water:
 - ‘Community’ facilities with a population served (population served + sells to) > 3,300.
- Wastewater:
 - >.1 MGD Permitted Capacity for Domestic Facilities.
 - All NPDES Domestic Facilities.
 - Industrial NPDES Wastewater systems (excluding Generic Permits and Animal Feeding Operations).
- **To filter using different criteria than what is in the Secretary’s Summary Report, uncheck the ‘Mimic Secretary’s Report’ box.** This will enable a variety of drop down boxes to filter the data to better suit individual requests/needs. To submit the new filter, select the various filter options you desire and click the ‘Sort/Filter’ button. (Please note that there are different filtering options based upon program type: Wastewater and Drinking Water.)
- (4) Viewing Capability
 - The initial screen will only show 20 records at a time (for quicker viewing), but has the capability to view all the records at once. The user can cycle through 20 records at a time or view all the records. To change the amount of records shown, click the appropriate button listed below:
 - ‘Next 20 records’ – This will take the user to the next 20 records.
 - ‘Previous 20 records’ – This will take the user to the previous 20 records.
 - ‘View **x** Records’ – This will show all records for query.
 - Users can sort from a wide variety of fields, filter the information, and export the data to an Excel spreadsheet.
- (5) **Export**
 - By clicking the ‘Export’ button, the user can produce an Excel export of the report currently shown on the page.
- (6) Facility Information Drill Down
 - By clicking on a specific name hyperlink, the user can access the ‘Drill Down’ (below), detailing a specific facility’s information.

Facility Information Drill Down

- This screen has more detailed information regarding a particular facility and allows the user to view data regarding that system.
- Viewing data on this screen pertains to the following groupings: Facility Information, Facility Contact Information, Facility Status, Boil Water Notice (Drinking Water facilities ONLY), FRWA/FlaWarn Information, Comments, and Facility History.
 - *Facility Information:* Shows the metadata for a particular system, including name, location, and other helpful elements. (If this information needs to be changed, please contact your DEP/DOH contact, since the data is stored in a different database.)
 - *Facility Contact Information:* Shows the first contact in the application (others can be found below in the history section).
 - *Facility Information Status:* Shows the user the current status of the system, as well as other important details including: if they need immediate DEP follow up,

if they are on backup power, if all plants (Drinking Water) or lift stations (Wastewater) are operational, as well as the counts and statuses of plants (Drinking Water) or lift stations (Wastewater).

- *Boil Water Notice (Drinking Water Only)*: Tracks if a facility is on Boil Water Notice, the begin date of the Boil Water Notice, and the date in which the Boil Water Notice is rescinded. (After seven days, the Boil Water Notice data will be reset for a rescinded facility and cease to appear on the DOH Boil Water Notice Report.)
- *FRWA/FlaWarn Information*: Facilities will enter and prioritize information regarding labor, equipment, and materials. Staff will use this submitted information to assess and facilitate a more rapid mobilization to aid facilities in need. After 21 days of the last FRWA/FlaWarn facility update for a particular facility, the FRWA/FlaWarn information will reset. (This is to alleviate data entry by staff in keeping information up to date.)
- *Facility History*: The bottom of the page shows historical data regarding additional contacts associated with the system and a historical view of the facility status and comments. This will allow users to better see and understand what has happened to a facility over the course of an event.
