



FLORIDA DEEPWATER HORIZON RESPONSE WEEKLY UPDATE

January 18, 2012

Gulf Coast Incident Management Team/Florida Branch

- Gulf Coast Incident Management Team (GCIMT) remains active in New Orleans with the Florida Branch Office located in Mary Esther, FL.
- Supporting the GCIMT is Darryl Boudreau (FDEP), State On-Scene Coordinator, and George Henderson (FWC), State Scientific Support Coordinator. Both Darryl and George staffed the GCIMT office.
- Representatives from the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG), FDEP and BP are staffing the Florida Branch Office.
- The Florida Branch, is supervising the activities of two Divisions, staffed by BP and their contract personnel with USCG oversight:
 - Division 1 - Western Escambia County (Perdido Key)
 - Division 2 - Eastern Escambia (Pensacola Beach), Santa Rosa, Okaloosa, Walton, Bay, Gulf, Franklin and Wakulla Counties.

Florida Activities

- A weekly FL command conference call for response activities is held every Wednesday at 8 am CDT. This call includes personnel supporting the GCIMT, FL Branch (FDEP, USCG, & BP Branch Director) and Department of Emergency Management (DEM).
- Three Shoreline Cleanup Assessment teams (SCAT), that include FDEP personnel, continue to conduct scientific assessments of the FL coast on a daily basis. Teams document oil found and provide cleanup recommendations.
- Product continues to be collected, documented and weighed by segment on a daily basis.

Florida Activities continued

- Continued discussions and meetings on the GCIMT Phase III Response Activities Completion Plan. Final version is under review and is expected to be signed next week.
- The Army Corps of Engineers GIWW Dredge Project is complete and equipment has been removed from Sugar Island. The temporary hold has been lifted for these segments; Operations will resume normal Patrol and Maintenance activities.
- The SCAT Post Hurricane Season Surveys were completed on January 14, 2012. Approximately 39 miles of shoreline was inspected. Of the shorelines inspected, approximately 1.5 miles had a minor amount of tarballs observed which were collected during the inspection. All of these shorelines met standards upon re-inspection. Approximately one quarter of a mile of beach was returned to Operations for continued cleanup.
- The State approved the following document(s)/plan(s):
 - Shoreline Inspection Reports (SIR's) - for Post Hurricane Season surveys for segments FLBA3-016 to 020, FLFK1-113 to 115, FLFK2-001 to 004, FLFK3-008, 013 and 018 and FLFK3-019 to 022. These segments were previously declared operationally inactive and upon inspection met endpoint criteria.
 - Shoreline Inspection Reports (SIR-(2)) - for segments FLES1-044 and 045 (Eastern Portion) and FLES2-157 and 158. These segments met shoreline cleanup criteria and will be removed from the response.
