



FLORIDA DEEPWATER HORIZON RESPONSE WEEKLY UPDATE

March 22, 2013

Gulf Coast Incident Management Team/Florida Branch

- Gulf Coast Incident Management Team (GCIMT) remains active in New Orleans, LA with the consolidated MS/AL/FL Branch Office located in Gulf Shores, AL.
- Supporting the GCIMT is George Henderson (FWC), State On-Scene Coordinator (SOSC). George staffed the NOLA office this week.
- Representatives from the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG), FDEP and BP are staffing the consolidated Branch Office.
- The Florida Branch, is supervising the activities of two Divisions, staffed by BP and their contract personnel with USCG oversight:
 - Division 1 - Western Escambia County (Perdido Key)
 - Division 2 - Eastern Escambia (Pensacola Beach) and Okaloosa Counties.

Florida Activities

- One Shoreline Cleanup Assessment Technique (SCAT) team, that includes FDEP personnel, continues to conduct scientific assessments of the FL coast on a daily basis. The team documents oil found and provides cleanup recommendations.
- Product continues to be collected, documented and weighed by segment on a daily basis.

Florida Activities continued

- Draft Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was sent back to CG legal for their review on March 21st. CG edits were received on March 22nd. The MOU is anticipated to be finalized and signed next week.
- Shoreline Treatment Recommendation, STR-FL-4-018, was approved on March 20th. The STR covers trenching/augering to look for subsurface oil and subsequent oil removal, if necessary, on Pensacola Beach segments FLES2-018 to 025.
- A Buried Oil Project (BOP) meeting was held on March 21st. The State still has no visibility on a work scope plan for Pensacola Beach, however at this time the plan is to trench/auger the polygons in segments FLES2-018 to 020 and then evaluate the need to do segments FLES2-021 to 025. State is working with the SRIA to identify appropriate access points for mechanical equipment.
- Was informed by the BOP that they are working on identifying polygons and drafting a STR for Perdido Key Amenity Beach. Have received no additional information or data related to the project.
- NPS EPEVP update- following the SIR (2) survey on segment FLES3-003, the FOSC directed the segment return to Operations for one sweep and then repeat SIR (2).
- Snorkel SCAT team 8 worked in Florida this week. They surveyed portions of segments FLES1-001 and 002 (Perdido Key); no submerged oil mats were located. The team is surveying segment FLES1-022 (GUIS- Perdido Key) today.
- The weekly individual state SCAT/NPS meetings at the Branch office are going to combine into one meeting. The meeting will now cover MS, AL and FL; a trial meeting is scheduled on Tuesday, March 26th.
