



FLORIDA DEEPWATER HORIZON RESPONSE WEEKLY UPDATE

March 29, 2013

Gulf Coast Incident Management Team/Florida Branch

- Gulf Coast Incident Management Team (GCIMT) remains active in New Orleans, LA with the consolidated MS/ AL/FL Branch Office located in Gulf Shores, AL.
- Supporting the GCIMT is George Henderson (FWC), State On-Scene Coordinator (SOSC). George provided remote support this week.
- Representatives from the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG), FDEP and BP are staffing the consolidated Branch Office.
- The Florida Branch, is supervising the activities of two Divisions, staffed by BP and their contract personnel with USCG oversight:
 - Division 1 - Western Escambia County (Perdido Key)
 - Division 2 - Eastern Escambia (Pensacola Beach) and Okaloosa Counties.

Florida Activities

- One Shoreline Cleanup Assessment Technique (SCAT) team, that includes FDEP personnel, continues to conduct scientific assessments of the FL coast on a daily basis. The team documents oil found and provides cleanup recommendations.
- Product continues to be collected, documented and weighed by segment on a daily basis.

Florida Activities continued

- The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was finalized and signed by the State and the USCG. Effective date of the agreement March 28, 2013.
- Received and reviewed the Work Plan for the Buried Oil Project (BOP) on Pensacola Beach segments FLES2-018 to 020. Access points and night time staging of equipment on the beach have been approved. The project is anticipated to start early to mid next week.
- In observance of Easter, GCIMT will be stood down from 1700 March 28 to 0530 April 1. No beach cleaning operations will be conducted during this time. No SCAT surveys will be conducted from March 28 through April 1.
- Okaloosa County EPEVP update- Monitoring surveys have been conducted on all five segments. SIR (2) surveys are scheduled for next week.
- Naval Air Station (NAS) EPEVP update- segment FLES1-042 was returned to OPS for one sweep following the Monitoring survey; SCAT was unable to fully mitigate/collect all the material. Second Monitoring survey also found too much material for SCAT to mitigate.
- The State and NAS requested a snorkel SCAT survey of segment FLES1-043.
- NPS EPEVP update- the FOOSC reviewed the SCAT and OPS data; the following segments will be signed out of the response.
 - GUIS Perdido Key- FLES1-024 to 029
 - GUIS Ft. Pickens- FLES1-033 and 034
 - GUIS Santa Rosa- FLES3-007, 009, 013 and 014.
