



FLORIDA DEEPWATER HORIZON RESPONSE WEEKLY UPDATE

April 12, 2013

Gulf Coast Incident Management Team/Florida Branch

- Gulf Coast Incident Management Team (GCIMT) remains active in New Orleans, LA with the consolidated MS/AL/FL Branch Office located in Gulf Shores, AL.
- Supporting the GCIMT is George Henderson (FWC), State On-Scene Coordinator (SOSC). George staffed the NOLA office this week.
- Representatives from the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG), FDEP and BP are staffing the consolidated Branch Office.
- The Florida Branch, is supervising the activities of two Divisions, staffed by BP and their contract personnel with USCG oversight:
 - Division 1 - Western Escambia County (Perdido Key)
 - Division 2 - Eastern Escambia (Pensacola Beach) and Okaloosa Counties.

Florida Activities

- Two Shoreline Cleanup Assessment Technique (SCAT) teams, that include FDEP personnel, continue to conduct scientific assessments of the FL coast on a daily basis. The teams document oil found and provide cleanup recommendations.
- Product continues to be collected, documented and weighed by segment on a daily basis.

Florida Activities continued

- Pensacola Beach Buried Oil Project (BOP) – Seven of the ten polygons are complete. No oil was recovered this week.
- The BOP project for Perdido Key Amenity Beach is not being pursued at this time due to physical and environmental constraints and the minimal success of the BOP on Pensacola Beach.
- Okaloosa County EPEVP update- SIR (2) surveys have been completed; data packets are being developed for the FOOSC to review.
- Twelve GUIS segments, FLES1-024, 025, 026, 027, 028, 029, FLES1-033 and 034, and FLES3-007, 009, 013, 014 were signed out of Response through the EPEVP.
- The FOOSC is continuing discussions with NPS, State and County representatives on strategies to move the remaining active segments in Florida to the NRC process.
