



FLORIDA DEEPWATER HORIZON RESPONSE WEEKLY UPDATE

May 10, 2013

Gulf Coast Incident Management Team/Florida Branch

- Gulf Coast Incident Management Team (GCIMT) remains active in New Orleans, LA with the consolidated MS/AL/FL Branch Office located in Gulf Shores, AL.
- Supporting the GCIMT is George Henderson (FWC), State On-Scene Coordinator (SOSC). George staffed the NOLA office this week.
- Representatives from the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG), FDEP and BP are staffing the consolidated Branch Office.
- The Florida Branch, is supervising the activities of two Divisions, staffed by BP and their contract personnel with USCG oversight:
 - Division 1 - Western Escambia County (Perdido Key)
 - Division 2 - Eastern Escambia County (Pensacola Beach)

Florida Activities

- One Shoreline Cleanup Assessment Technique (SCAT) team, that includes FDEP personnel, continues to conduct scientific assessments of the FL coast on a daily basis. The team documents oil found and provides cleanup recommendations.
- Product continues to be collected, documented and weighed by segment on a daily basis.

Florida Activities continued

- SCAT has been conducting RADC (Removal Actions Deemed Complete) surveys on Gulf Islands National Seashore (GUIS) segments all week. SCAT was unable to mitigate all the oil on many of the segments. Surveys should be completed this weekend.
- OSRO/strike teams were deployed to GUIS- Perdido Key after National Response Center (NRC) reports were filed following SCAT surveys. Approximately 28 lb of SRBs were collected by the OSRO teams over two days. Both NRC reports have been closed out by the CG.
- Water Operations were limited or cancelled a majority of the week due to rough surf conditions.
- A Buried Oil Project (BOP)/OSAT 3 meeting was held on May 9th. The Eastern States BOP documents are being drafted; the OSAT 3 report is still being finalized.
