



FLORIDA DEEPWATER HORIZON RESPONSE WEEKLY UPDATE

May 17, 2013

Gulf Coast Incident Management Team/Florida Branch

- Gulf Coast Incident Management Team (GCIMT) remains active in New Orleans, LA with the consolidated MS/AL/FL Branch Office located in Gulf Shores, AL.
- Supporting the GCIMT is George Henderson (FWC), State On-Scene Coordinator (SOSC). George staffed the NOLA office this week.
- Representatives from the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG), FDEP and BP are staffing the consolidated Branch Office.
- The Florida Branch, is supervising the activities of two Divisions, staffed by BP and their contract personnel with USCG oversight:
 - Division 1 - Western Escambia County (Perdido Key)
 - Division 2 - Eastern Escambia County (Pensacola Beach)

Florida Activities

- One Shoreline Cleanup Assessment Technique (SCAT) team, that includes FDEP personnel, continues to conduct scientific assessments of the FL coast on a daily basis. The team documents oil found and provides cleanup recommendations.
- Product continues to be collected, documented and weighed by segment on a daily basis.

Florida Activities continued

- NPS RADC (Removal Actions Deemed Complete) SCAT surveys were completed on May 13th.
- Capt. Walker met with Escambia County Commissioner Grover Robinson on May 13. The Capt. announced his plan to remove the remaining Escambia County segments (Perdido Key and Pensacola amenity beaches, Sugar Island, and Naval Air Station (NAS)) from the response June 1st. An official notification letter was sent to the County on June 14th. The County intends to document their non-concurrence with the plan.
- NAS has requested a meeting with the Capt. to discuss his close-out plan and to meet the new Commanding Officer, Capt. Hoskins. NAS does not agree with the June 1 plan.
- The Memorial Day schedule was distributed. OPS teams will be stood down from 1700 May 24 to 0700 May 28. SCAT teams will be stood down from May 24 through May 28. One strike team will be on call for FL to respond to National Response Center (NRC) reports.
- Middle R (OSRO teams deployed in response to NRC reports)
 - An OSRO/strike team was deployed to GUIS Ft. McRee, segment FLES1-037 on May 13 following a SCAT survey. The crew recovered approximately 1.5 lb of oil.
 - OSRO/strike teams were deployed to GUIS Perdido Key, segments FLES1-016 to 023 on May 14 and 15. Crews recovered approximately 43.7 lb of oil.
 - All reports were closed out by the USCG.
- Additional NRC reports were filed by NPS for GUIS Santa Rosa and Ft. Pickens. NPS personnel were able to mitigate all the SRBs.
