



FLORIDA DEEPWATER HORIZON RESPONSE WEEKLY UPDATE

May 30, 2012

Gulf Coast Incident Management Team/Florida Branch

- Gulf Coast Incident Management Team (GCIMT) remains active in New Orleans with the Florida Branch Office located in Mary Esther, FL.
- Supporting the GCIMT is Darryl Boudreau (FDEP), State On-Scene Coordinator (SOSC), and George Henderson (FWC), State Scientific Support Coordinator (SSC). Darryl and George both staffed the GCIMT office this week.
- Representatives from the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG), FDEP and BP are staffing the Florida Branch Office.
- The Florida Branch, is supervising the activities of two Divisions, staffed by BP and their contract personnel with USCG oversight:
 - Division 1 - Western Escambia County (Perdido Key)
 - Division 2 - Eastern Escambia (Pensacola Beach), Santa Rosa, Okaloosa and Walton Counties.

Florida Activities

- A weekly FL command conference call for response activities is held every Wednesday at 0830 CDT. This call includes personnel supporting the GCIMT, FL Branch (FDEP, USCG, & BP Branch Director) and Department of Emergency Management (DEM).
- Three Shoreline Cleanup Assessment Technique (SCAT) teams, that include FDEP personnel, continue to conduct scientific assessments of the FL coast on a daily basis. Teams document oil found and provide cleanup recommendations.
- Product continues to be collected, documented and weighed by segment on a daily basis.

Florida Activities continued

- A SAP meeting with the FOSC and SOSC was held on May 24th. The outcome of the meeting resulted in the FOSC advancing segment FLOK2-029 to a MON (1) instead of returning to Operations. Segment FLOK2-031 was not advanced and is to remain with Operations to continue Patrol and Maintenance (P&M) activities.
- Snorkel SCAT team 8 returned to Alabama after sampling in Florida (May 22nd - 24th) in segment FLES2-019. The team found a couple of pits with larger SRB's but exploratory adjacent pits did not produce similar results. The team did not encounter any submerged oil mats.
- The Sand Borrow Area Sampling project was completed in Florida on May 26th. Nine samples were taken at each of the five borrow sites located in Escambia and Santa Rosa Counties. The sampling was conducted by Cardno Entrix with DEP and BP oversight. No visual oil was observed in any of the samples.
- In observance of Memorial Day, GCIMT was stood down from May 26th to the 28th.
- Continued discussions regarding expanding the subsurface delineation/recovery plan for use in other areas of Gulf Islands National Seashore. Target maps are still in development and revised Shoreline Treatment Recommendation (STR) language is being vetted through the National Park Service for approval. Finalized maps are anticipated at the end of the week.
- Ongoing data inventory and compilation regarding OSAT III. The next scheduled meeting with the working group will be the week of June 25th.
