Gulf Coast Incident Management Team/Florida Branch

- Gulf Coast Incident Management Team (GCIMT) remains active in New Orleans, LA with the consolidated MS/ AL/ FL Branch Office located in Gulf Shores, AL.
- Supporting the GCIMT is George Henderson (FWC), State On-Scene Coordinator (SOSC). George provided support remotely this week.
- Representatives from the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG), FDEP and BP are staffing the consolidated Branch Office.

Florida Activities

- One Shoreline Cleanup Assessment Technique (SCAT) team, that includes FDEP personnel, continues to conduct scientific assessments of the FL coast on a daily basis. The team documents oil found and provides cleanup recommendations.

Florida Activities continued

- Response Actions Deemed Complete (RADC) surveys were canceled June 5-7 due to TS Andrea and heavy sargassum deposits in the ITZ. Team 4 assessed beach conditions on the 7th and determined conditions are suitable for surveying. The team will resume RADC surveys on the 8th.
- 'Middle R' Waste Directive was distributed on June 4th (attached).
- The University of West Florida (UWF) Environmental Studies Program is interested in partnering with DEP for a student volunteer/internship with our Long Term Beach Monitoring Program. Developing a flyer with the program's details to distribute to students and other UWF programs to solicit interest.

- Met with the Pensacola Naval Air Station (NAS) on June 5th to discuss logistics of the State conducting long term beach monitoring on NAS property.
- BP's response contractor Danos has five ORSO teams scheduled on stand by to respond to National Response Center (NRC) reports next week.
- ORSO teams were deployed in response to two NRC calls this week.
 - June 4th to segments FLES1-022 and 023, GUIIS- Perdido Key. Crews collected approximately 15 lb of material. Report was closed out the CG the same day.
 - June 7th to segment FLES1-021, GUIIS- Perdido Key. Amount collected unknown at this time.
