Gulf Coast Incident Management Team/Florida Branch

- Gulf Coast Incident Management Team (GCIMT) remains active in New Orleans, LA with the consolidated MS/AL/FL Branch Office located in Gulf Shores, AL.
- Supporting the GCIMT is George Henderson (FWC), State On-Scene Coordinator (SOSC). George provided support remotely this week.
- Representatives from the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG), FDEP and BP are staffing the consolidated Branch Office.

Florida Activities continued

- The final Removal Actions Deemed Complete (RADDC) SCAT survey was completed on June 18, 2013. This survey ended all SCAT activity in Florida.
- A final coordination/meet and greet meeting with the National Park Service (NPS) was held on June 19th. The group worked out the final details of DEP conducting long term monitoring on NPS property and introduced personnel who will be working together after the Park's Oil Spill Division is demobilized on June 29, 2013.
- Continuing to wrap up response activities. Starting in July the only activities occurring in FL will be DEP's Beach Monitoring Program and the NRC weekly updates. The final response weekly update will be June 28, 2013.
- Thirteen NRC reports were filed between June 15th - 20th for oil in FL; all 13 were confirmed MC-252. The CG deployed OSRO teams on three reports.
 - FLES2-006, GUIS Fort Pickens- Crews recovered 1.80 lb
 - FLES2-018, Pensacola Amenity Beach- Crews recovered 3.00 lbs
 - FLES2-019, Pensacola Amenity Beach- Crews recovered 1.40 lb
