Weather (Meteorology):

Rain: Scattered strong and isolated severe thunderstorms in the western panhandle will diminish by sunset. **Lightning:** The remnants of Andrea have developed a band of showers with sporadic lightning strikes from the Treasure Coast northwestward into central Florida. These showers will also dissipate shortly after sunset. A few thunderstorms could become strong, with frequent lightning strikes and hail being the main hazards. Lightning may trigger additional wildfire starts this weekend. **Wind:** Winds across the state will be variable in direction with speeds of 10-15 mph and will be influenced by sea breezes during the afternoon.
