WHEREAS, knowledge of earth sciences is important for protecting Florida's residents and environment from the natural hazards that pose a threat to our economy and quality of life; and

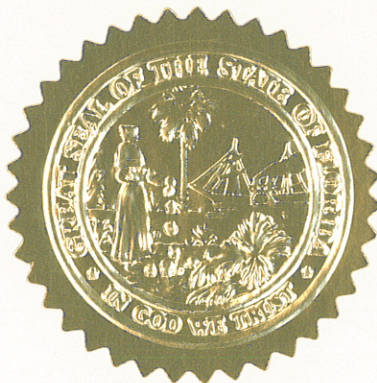
