SCA Completeness

Dear Reviewing Agencies:

We wanted to take this opportunity to provide you with an update on progress regarding review of Florida Power & Light Company's (FPL's) application for site certification for the new nuclear, Turkey Point 6 & 7 Project. FPL is committed to providing a new nuclear option for its customers and continues to pursue the licensing of the Turkey Point Units 6 & 7 Project. The benefits of new nuclear and this option remain as important today as ever offering improved fuel diversity, energy security, cost-effective electricity with no greenhouse gas emissions and improved reliable delivery of power through its associated transmission infrastructure.

FPL continues to work with the reviewing agencies on the completeness of the Site Certification Application (SCA). The transmission line component of the project's SCA is on a different review schedule from the balance of the project. This allows the licensing process to provide the opportunity for interested parties to propose alternate transmission corridor alignments for consideration. Currently, of the more than twenty government agencies involved in the project, there are three who have a few remaining transmission completeness requests.

FPL has begun to work with those agencies who have found the transmission portions of the application complete, to support the preparation of their agency reports, identification and resolution of issues, and drafting of conditions of certification. Under the current approved SCA schedule, Agency reports are due June 10, 2010 (June 25, 2010 for agencies headed by a collegial body).

As a result of the outstanding completeness requests from these three agencies, the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) issued its Third Determination of Incompleteness for the transmission line portion of the application on Tuesday, March 23, 2010.

The Fifth Revised Schedule for review of the application, which the ALJ approved on February 10, 2010, lays out a schedule for FPL to contest the Department's determination. FPL believes that the remaining completeness requests are not procedurally appropriate at this stage of the process, and would be more appropriate for inclusion as comments, recommendations, or proposed conditions of certification in the Agency Reports on transmission aspects of the project. However, at this time FPL has decided to continue to work cooperatively to try to resolve these few remaining completeness requests. A revised schedule reflecting another round of transmission completeness responses by FPL and a fourth determination by the Department is being pursued.

FPL is committed to working with agencies to address agency completeness items, resolve issues and negotiate conditions of certification. We look forward to working further with all of the reviewing agencies on this important infrastructure project for Florida and addressing your questions or issues in a mutually acceptable manner.
