NPDES GENERIC PERMITS

62-621.300 Permits.

Requests for coverage under any of the permits in this rule, may be submitted electronically using the Department's electronic submittal Notice of Intent system when available.

(1) Generic Permit for Discharges from Petroleum Storage and Petroleum Contaminated Sites. ~~Generic Permit for Discharges From Petroleum Contaminated Sites.~~

(a) The document "Generic Permit for Discharges from ~~From~~ Petroleum Storage and Petroleum Contaminated Sites," document number 62-621.300(1)(a), issued by the Department and effective Month Day, Year, February 14, 2000, is hereby adopted and incorporated by reference and made part of this Chapter. This document may be obtained by either contacting the local Department District Office, by writing the Department of Environmental Protection, Industrial Wastewater Section, Mail Station #3545, 2600 Blair Stone Road, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-2400 or from the Department's website.

(b) Form 62-621.300(1)(b), Notice of Intent to Use the Generic Permit for Discharges from Petroleum Storage and Petroleum Contaminated Sites, (NOI), effective Month Day, Year, is hereby adopted and incorporated by reference and made part of this Chapter. This form may be obtained by either contacting the local Department District Office, by writing the Department of Environmental Protection, Industrial Wastewater Section, Mail Station #3545, 2600 Blair Stone Road, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-2400 or from the Department's website. ~~The document referenced in paragraph 62-621.300(1)(a), F.A.C., contains the specific discharge limits, operating requirements, and application requirements for discharges from petroleum-contaminated sites.~~

(c) Applicability and Coverage

1. Coverage under this generic permit is available for discharge of ground water from petroleum storage and petroleum contaminated sites to surface waters of the State, provided all criteria specified in this generic permit are met. Applicants seeking coverage under this permit shall submit a Notice of Intent to Use the Generic Permit for Discharges from Petroleum Storage and Petroleum Contaminated Sites, DEP Form 62-621.300(1)(b). The permittee may provide treatment to meet effluent limitations as specified in this generic permit.

2. Discharge of ground water during the replacement, removal or repair of petroleum products storage tank systems is covered by this generic permit.

3. This generic permit authorizes the discharge of ground water from petroleum storage and petroleum contaminated sites under the State's federally-approved NPDES program only and does not relieve the permittee of the responsibility of obtaining any other federal, state, or local government permit.

1 4. Short-term discharges that do not require treatment to meet effluent
2 limitations specified in this generic permit shall submit the request for coverage at least
3 30 days prior to planned commencement of discharge.

4 5. Coverage under this generic permit for short-term discharges of ground
5 water that do not require treatment to meet effluent limits specified in this generic permit
6 shall be effective 30 days after Department receipt of the request for coverage, unless
7 the Department notifies the permittee within that time period that the request for
8 coverage is not complete and requests additional information or that the project does
9 not qualify for a generic permit. Permittee shall have proof of delivery to the Department
10 of the request for coverage before discharging ground water.

11 6. Coverage under this generic permit for all long-term discharges or short
12 term discharges of ground water that require treatment to meet effluent limitations
13 specified in this generic permit shall not be effective until the applicant receives written
14 notification from the Department.

15 7. Discharge of ground water from sites with levels of benzene, naphthalene,
16 or lead in amounts that exceed screening limits in Table 1 of the NOI, are not authorized
17 by this generic permit, unless treatment is provided to meet the effluent limitations prior
18 to discharge.

19 (d) Period of Coverage

20 1. Short-term discharges of ground water are limited to a term not to exceed
21 thirty (30) cumulative days of discharge occurring within one year of the effective date of
22 coverage.

23 2. Long-term discharges of ground water are limited to a term not to exceed
24 five years from the effective date of coverage.

25 (e) Requests for Coverage

26 1. Requests for coverage under this generic permit shall be submitted to the
27 local Department District Office and shall include the following items:

28 a. Completed Notice of Intent to Use Generic Permit for Discharges from
29 Petroleum Storage and Petroleum Contaminated Sites, DEP Form 62-621.300(1)(b).

30 b. Applicable generic permit fee pursuant to Rule 62-4.050, F.A.C.

31 2. A permittee with short-term discharge coverage under this generic permit
32 may request renewal of coverage one time, within six months following termination of
33 the period of coverage in subparagraph 62-621.300(1)(d)1., F.A.C. A permittee with
34 short-term coverage may request long-term coverage under this generic permit in
35 accordance with the requirements in subparagraph 62-621.300(1)(e)1., F.A.C.

36 3. The permittee may request continued coverage under this generic permit
37 for long-term discharges, in accordance with the requirements contained in paragraph
38 62-621.300(1)(e), F.A.C., at least 180 days before expiration of current coverage.

39 4. Request for transfer of ownership under this generic permit for long-term
40 discharges shall be submitted to the local Department District Office using DEP Form
41 62-620.910(11) and the appropriate processing fee pursuant to Rule 62-4.050, F.A.C.
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1 (2) Generic Permit for Discharge of Ground Water from Dewatering
2 Operations, Generic Permit for Discharge of Produced Ground Water From any Non-
3 Contaminated Site Activity.

4 (a) The document "Generic Permit for Discharge of Ground Water from
5 Dewatering Operations, Generic Permit for Discharge of Produced Ground Water From-
6 any Non-Contaminated Site Activity." document number 62-621.300(2)(a), issued by the
7 Department and effective Month Day, Year, is hereby adopted and incorporated by
8 reference and made part of this Chapter. This document may be obtained by either
9 contacting the local Department District Office by writing to the Department of
10 Environmental Protection, Industrial Wastewater Section, Mail Station #3545, 2600 Blair
11 Stone Road, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-2400 or from the Department's website.

12 (b) Form 62-621.300(2)(b), Notice of Intent to Use the Generic Permit for
13 Discharge of Ground Water from Dewatering Operations, (NOI), effective Month Day,
14 Year, is hereby adopted and incorporated by reference and made part of this Chapter.
15 This form may be obtained by either contacting the local Department District Office by
16 writing the Department of Environmental Protection, Industrial Wastewater Section, Mail
17 Station #3545, 2600 Blair Stone Road, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-2400 or from the
18 Department's website. The document referenced in paragraph 62-621.300(2)(a), F.A.C.,
19 contains the specific discharge limits, operating requirements for discharges of
20 produced ground water from any site activity.

21 (c) Applicability and Coverage

22 1. Coverage under this generic permit is available for discharge of ground
23 water from dewatering operations to surface waters of the State, provided all criteria
24 specified in this generic permit are met. Applicants seeking coverage under this permit
25 shall submit a Notice of Intent to Use the Generic Permit for Discharge of Ground Water
26 from Dewatering Operations, DEP Form 62-621.300(2)(b). The permittee may provide
27 treatment to meet effluent limitations as specified in this generic permit.

28 2. This generic permit authorizes the discharge of ground water from
29 dewatering operations under the State's federally-approved NPDES program only and
30 does not relieve the permittee of the responsibility of obtaining any other federal, state,
31 or local government permit.

32 3. For the purposes of this chapter, 'dewatering operations' shall be defined
33 as temporarily lowering the ground water level whether confined or unconfined, by
34 mechanical pumping for construction, excavation, installation and maintenance of
35 underground utilities or structures or aquifer performance tests for exploratory
36 purposes.

37 4. This generic permit does not cover pumping of stormwater or water from
38 existing basements and foundations, water from mining operations (including borrow
39 pits), discharges from aquifer storage and recovery wells (ASRs) or mechanical integrity
40 testing of underground injection control wells.

1 5. Short-term discharges that do not require treatment to meet effluent
2 limitations specified in this generic permit shall submit the request for coverage at least
3 30 days prior to planned commencement of discharge.

4 6. Coverage under this generic permit for short-term discharges of ground
5 water that do not require treatment to meet effluent limitations specified in this generic
6 permit shall be effective 30 days after Department receipt of the request for coverage,
7 unless the Department notifies the permittee within that time period that the request for
8 coverage is not complete and requests additional information or that the project does
9 not qualify for a generic permit. Permittee shall have proof of delivery to the Department
10 of request for coverage before discharging ground water.

11 7. Coverage under this generic permit for all long-term discharges or short-
12 term discharges of ground water that require treatment to meet effluent limitations
13 specified in this generic permit shall not be effective until the applicant receives written
14 notification from the Department.

15 (d) Period of Coverage

16 1. Short-term discharges of ground water from dewatering operations are
17 limited to a term not to exceed thirty (30) cumulative days of discharge occurring within
18 one year of the effective date of coverage.

19 2. Long-term discharges of ground water from dewatering operations are
20 limited to a term not to exceed five years from the effective date of coverage.

21 (e) Requests for Coverage

22 1. Requests for coverage under this generic permit shall be submitted to the
23 local Department District Office and shall include the following items:

24 a. Completed Notice of Intent to Use Generic Permit for Discharge of Ground
25 Water from Dewatering Operations, DEP Form 62-621.300(2)(b).

26 b. Applicable generic permit fee pursuant to Rule 62-4.050, F.A.C.

27 2. A permittee with short-term discharge coverage under this generic permit
28 may request renewal of coverage one time, within six months following termination of
29 the period of coverage in subparagraph 62-621.300(2)(d)1., F.A.C. A permittee with
30 short-term coverage may request long-term coverage under this generic permit in
31 accordance with the requirements in subparagraph 62-621.300(2)(e)1., F.A.C.

32 3. The permittee may request continued coverage under this generic permit
33 for long-term discharges, in accordance with the requirements contained in paragraph
34 62-621.300(2)(e), F.A.C., at least 180 days before expiration of current coverage.

35 4. Request for transfer of ownership under this generic permit for long-term
36 discharges shall be submitted to the local Department District Office using DEP Form
37 62-620.910(11) and the appropriate processing fee pursuant to Chapter 62-4.050,
38 F.A.C.
